This scale was adopted by NGC when it began operations in 1987 and is considered to be the industry standard. Coin grading is the process of determining the grade or condition of a coin, one of the key factors in determining its value. A coin's grade is generally determined by five criteria: strike, preservation, luster, color, and attractiveness. Several grading systems have been developed.

The issue of strike is less important when grading unworn or mint state coins. Here, market grading really comes to the forefront, as the most important factors when determining the grade of a mint state coin are surface quality, luster and color. Surface quality simply refers to the number of contact marks and abrasions a coin has received.

The Sheldon Scale ranges from a grade of Poor (P-1) to Perfect Mint State (MS-70). Originally coins were graded using adjectives to describe the condition of the coin (Good, Fair, Excellent, Etc.).
